Letter From Lisvane

Christmas 2021

So - what have we been doing this past year? That's a really good question...

Lisvane is changing, that's for certain. At the end of our Close, the old house bequeathed to the church was demolished, and a new church community centre is being built. This is going to take a while, and has been taking a while, but the walls are now at least going up. New housing estates are being built not too far away; some already have houses being lived in whilst the rest of the estate is still being finished.

At the bottom of our garden, the old smithy site (the smithy was demolished years ago) is having a 4/5 bedroom house built on it. There isn't a garden to speak of given the size of the plot. We've lost the fence put up 20 years ago, as the gradient of the land, and the need for a retaining wall, meant a new one had to be installed, a cantilevered reinforced concrete retaining wall. This meant we had a temporary wire panel 'fence' in place, and that the ground did slump a little after a heavy rainfall. However, we've now got a new fence and a new border which is being treated as a blank canvas - most of what was there went when the old fence came down.

She's now invigilating the miniature donkeys which are accompanying the puppets on their visits to to various Cardiff primary schools. An interesting change of vocation, though she does report there is still some element of kicking and biting. David is still working, more-or-less full time from home. There's the odd dash into the office for those rare things that can't be done remotely, like helping collate letters and put them in envelopes, or putting labels on envelopes. We did manage to get up to Aberystwyth a good few times, both together and separately, to check in on the house and oversee repair works. It's a good place to get away from it all, so it is being made use of.



David even managed to get away to Norfolk this year, back to Walcott and the Seals Hotel (formerly the Keswick). It was a bit ironic that the day he went up was the day the infamous British petrol panic buying crisis struck, but he managed to find petrol in Norfolk the day he arrived, and then did only 30 miles or so in the car before heading back to Wales. He did a lot of walking, quite a lot of it on beaches, saw some seals, and on the last night saw a glorious sunset with a complete double rainbow. On the way home he



stopped off at a local butchers for bacon and sausages, and was remembered as "that bloke from Cardiff".
